The address was given by Prof. George E. Vincent, University of Chicago, who took for his subject "Efficiency and Education," developing the thought that education to be useful should be specialized. It is not so much the quantity of knowledge one possesses, but the ability to apply it to practical affairs of life. This age is especially the age of the specialist, and the successful man must apply himself to attaining skill in some one direction.

After the address, J. E. Walrond, president of the school board, made a short speech and presented the diploma.
