OLD LANDMARK IS TORN DOWN

The old railroad water tower located behind the city building in Federation Park has been torn down.

The historic landmark recently was turned over to the city by the Pennsylvania Railroad. Equipped with diesel engines the railroad found little use for the tower and hadn't actually used it in the past two years, according to A. H. Dean Pennsylvania Railroad Agent.

Veteran observers in the County building couldn't recall when the tower was built, but estimate it was at least 25 years ago. It was used to supply trains busily servicing the Petoskey Depot.
