EMMET COUNTY FLAG, made of pure silk and measuring about five feet by eight feet, was found this week in the county building when extension agent K. C. Festerling, left, was sorting out stored articles in preparing for the big move this fall when the construction starts on the new city-county building. The flag was presented to the Emmet 4-H Clubs in September, 1940 by the J. L. Hudson Company of Detroit as a civic progress award. The company made 83 different county flags upon recommendations of various city and county groups, school commissioners, chambers of commerce and newspaper publishers. Emmet's flag is white with a red border and multicolored emblem, it is now hanging on display in the bail at the court house. With each flag given by the company was a book giving the county history of each of the 83 counties.
