## FISHERMEN HAVE BAD TIME ON ICE

BECOME LOST WHILE ON WAY  
HOME DURING RECENT  
HARD STORM

Many Petoskey Men Now Use Com-  
pass in Laying Course from  
Fishing Grounds.

Petoskey fishermen are using more care in making trips to and from their fish shanties on the bay, especially in the case where shanties are on the outer beds.

Recently a party of men encountered considerable difficulty in locating the home base and wandered about on the bay for some time before finally reaching shore near Bay View.

They started for their shanties during a hard blow which carried clouds of snow in their faces. Turning to escape the wind they unconsciously drifted from their course and became lost.

Most of the fishermen are now equipping themselves with compasses and are better able to lay a straight course over the rough ice during the stormy weather.

PETOSKEY FISHING CAMP IS  
OPENED THERE WEDNESDAY  
BY OLD TIMERS.

Captain Walter Chrysler Heads Com-  
pany of "Hook and Line"  
Artists After Big Ones.

Petoskey fishermen opened the Petoskey Fishing Camp at Nine Mile Point Wednesday morning for the remainder of the winter. Captain Walter Chrysler headed a company of "hook and line" artists to the camp and during the remainder of the fishing season these men will try their luck with the big fellows off shore at that point.

On the shore of the bay at Nine Mile Point are a number of very comfortable log cabins erected by the fishermen several seasons ago, and these have been made ready for this season. The fish caught by this company are sold in Petoskey. The men fish as far as six miles off shore during favorable weather.
