'Nother Fire

Petoskey was visited by another fire early Monday morning when the grocery store and meat market of James Hitchings, at the corner of Ingalls avenue and Charlevoix avenue, was destroyed causing a loss of about twenty-two hundred dollars.

The fire was first discovered by Vern Bowman, an employe at the paper mill, at 3:30 o'clock, but it had a big start before being discovered and was blazing through the roof when the firemen arrived on the scene.

About a half hour's work with three streams of water put out the blaze but not until the entire stock and the building had been practically destroyed.

The building was owned by Will Ingalls, and the loss on this is estimated at one thousand dollars, with no insurance. Mr. Hitchings carried about one thousand dollars insurance on his stock of groceries and meats so that his actual loss will not be over two or three hundred dollars.

The fire started in the south-west corner of the building from some unknown cause.
