**OPENS SOON.**

**The Popular Vaudeville With a Corps  
of Excellent Help.**

The Vaudeville, one of Petoskey's first five-cent picture theaters, which has been closed throughout the winter, will be opened to the public Wednesday, April 1. Manager Winnie has been in the city for the past few days, overseeing the completion of the improvement details. The theater will be under the direct management of Hal Lewis, who will also sing the illustrated songs. Mr. Lewis has been one of the leading baritones of the "Yankee Doodle Boy" and will undoubtedly be a good drawing card for the theater. The services of N. C. Perry as pianist and Miss Edith Seymour as cashier have been secured by the management, Beryl Bain operating the picture machines. With such a competent force of experienced people, there is no doubt but that the service extended to the visiting public will be first class. The theater has undergone a number of improvements that will be a decided convenience, the raised floor, gas lights for emergency cases, constantly lighted entrances and exits, etc. The operating room is constructed entirely of steel, with a number of new attachments to the machine so that the film could not burn up. The film service will be first class in every respect, the pictures wholly moral and refined, with dissolving views for the illustrated songs. The entire building has been accepted by the fire insurance inspectors, who state that every part of the laws have been complied with.
