

GOOD SKATING ON BAY IS REPORTED

ICE SAID TO BE SIX TO EIGHT INCHES

Best Clear Fields Are Off Arlington Heights Toward Harbor Springs. Bay Frozen Over.

Good skating is reported on the bay off Arlington Heights. The ice is said to be from six to eight inches thick and has apparently come to stay.

Clear fields of delightfully clear ice are found not a great distance from shore and may easily be reached by going down Midway and then out the Pere Marquette tracks toward Bay View.

The bay appears to be entirely frozen over again this morning. Frost in the air prevented a clear view of the outer reaches but with such clear cold weather as that of last night ice must surely have formed over the entire bay.

Many Petoskey people enjoy skating and it is expected that the ice will be covered with skaters if conditions are as favorable as reported.

If the clear fields are of large enough area ice boating may again be enjoyed on the bay. It has been several years since this sport was had here.
