WAR EXPERIENCES.

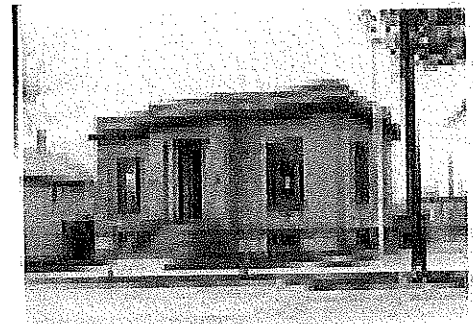
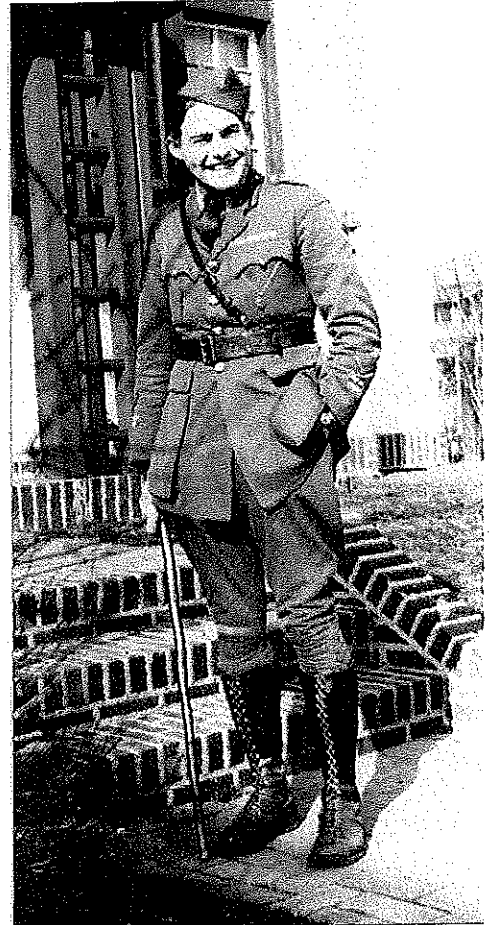
Grade Schools Also Hear Interesting  
Talks From Men Who Served  
With the Army Overseas.

At the high school yesterday Hemenway, of Oak Park, Ill., who was with the Allied armies in Italy, told the high school students some of his war experiences, as a part of the Armistice Day activities.

Mr. Hemenway spent the summer with his parents at their Walloon Lake summer home, and during the autumn has been in Petoskey. He was badly wounded during the fighting in Italy and believes Northern Michigan climate is aiding him to recover his health.

Prof. Charles Kuttler, who was with the forestry section of the U. S. Engineers in France, told some of his experiences during the war. Mr. Kuttler also spoke at Sheridan street school. At Lincoln school James Niles gave a most interesting talk to the children, while at Central school Mr. Van Every, a returned soldier, talked on the war.

In December 1919, at Petoskey's Carnegie Library Ernest Hemingway, wearing his World War I uniform spoke to the Ladies Aid Society about his World War I experiences.
